- The 2nd June marks the official coronation of Queen Elizabeth. **1953**
- The new millennium starts. **2000**
- The iPad is launched. **2010**
- The Queen becomes the longest– reigning monarch in British history. **2015**
- The Queen celebrates her Sapphire Jubilee marking 65 years since she ascended the throne. **2017**

Key Facts

- A memory is something remembered from the past. They can be good or bad.
- Toys from the 1900's were often made from wood or metal but modern day toys are often made from plastic.
- Transport is something that takes something or someone from one place to another.
- A family tree is a diagram showing the relationship between people in several generations of a family.
- A timeline is a display of a list of events that document stages of life or key events.
- Queen Elizabeth II was born on the 26th April 1926.
- The coronation of Queen Elizabeth II was on the 2nd June 1953 at Westminster Abbey.
- The five senses are: taste, touch, sight, smell and hearing.
