Key Facts

- A family is your Mum, Dad, brother, sister, aunty, uncle, gran, grandad, cousin, nephew and niece.
- An extended family is step Mum or step Dad.
- Everyone's lifetime has chronological order from baby to adult. Baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult and elderly.
- All families are different and unique.
- We have a school family which is everyone who learns at Ardleigh Green.

Key Vocabulary
