- Earth is the planet where we, humans live.
- The Sun is not a planet, it is a star.
- The sun does not move, the planets do.
- An astronaut is a person who visits, works or lives in space.
- The international space station is like a 'hotel' for astronauts.
- Space is a vast, huge place that we are still learning about.

The world - The world is a very big place with lots of different countries.

Astronaut - A person who is trained to travel in space.
Solar system - The collection of 8 planets that orbit the sun.

Orbit - The path of a planet or spacecraft around a star.
